Join us for an engaging pre-conference day exploring the critical role of mental health in fostering inclusive education and communities. Our event will feature leading scholars in the field, Dr. Jace Pillay and Dr. Bephyer Parey, who will share their expertise on mental health, inclusion, and global perspectives on achieving Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG4) – ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education for all.

Dr. Jace Pillay – South African Research Chair in Education and Care in Childhood, University of Johannesburg. Dr. Pillay is a renowned expert in child and youth mental health, focusing on psychosocial support in schools. As a registered educational and counseling psychologist, he has contributed extensively to research on vulnerable children, education policy, and mental health interventions. He also serves as the Chairperson of the Education, Training, and Registration Committee for the Professional Board of Psychology in South Africa.





Dr. Bephyer Parey – Junior Research Fellow, Chair of the Disability Studies Research Cluster, University of the West Indies (UWI). Dr. Parey's research focuses on disability inclusion, social policy, and the role of educators in fostering belonging and well-being. Her PhD research examined disability inclusion in Trinidad, addressing topics such as teachers' attitudes, accessibility in education and employment, and the well-being of individuals with disabilities. She is currently investigating teaching and learning dynamics during the pandemic and the lived experiences of people with disabilities in various sectors.




BABY NEWS!
